The LA Times reported “Traditional AM/FM radio is still the most popular way for people to listen to music, news and talk, even as digital music offers more control and may be easier to use on the go.” A recent study of 2,000 people in the U.S. indicated that just over one half said they listen to regular AM/FM radio at least once a day, more than any other platform. Matthew) who recently died of cancer. The Rawang people live in Myanmar, Thailand, China, India and Malaysia. Radio broadcasts (started years ago by LaVerne Morse and family) are especially effective in reaching the remote areas of these countries where missionaries do not or cannot serve - places where Christianity has severe competition from local religions for the hearts and minds of tribal people. GBM-TCH has supported the Rawang program for many years - and to continue we must raise another \$300 per month support to help meet the needs of these men and their families. Rawang radio programs contain sermons, Bible lessons and hymns and choruses recorded by this five-voice women's choir and others. ▼

An editing bay in ChiangMai, Thailand that is being used by our team members to record daily Christian programs in four or more SE Asian languages. When produced and ready to be placed on air, programs are delivered by Internet to one of several short-wave transmitters operated by FEBC, (Far East Broadcasting Company) in Manila, Philippines. From there they are broadcast daily to radio listeners throughout SE Asia. Our Lisu broadcast are also streamed on-line. We are pleased to partner with Asia Christian Services, and with FEBC in our broadcasting efforts - and we are long-time National Religious Broadcasters members.

Aldi Mark is truly "key" to the work we do overseas. He not only supervises and runs the GBM studio in ChiangMai, Thailand, - but leads trips and mission visits into areas of the world where our programs are heard to follow-up. Earlier this year he gives this Lisu woman a shortwave, battery-operated radio for her home and village.

Mark said: "We thank you for your support of travel expenses for this time. Travel into other countries is the best way to communicate with radio listeners. In Myanmar, I met one of our radio staff, Ezra John. He spends much of his time in China teaching in seminars. Ezra said he met a radio listener who copied 1,200 of our radio messages to give other people - I was so impressed. Everywhere we met radio listeners who said they are so proud of our radio programs - they are like friends. They listen every night and get much encouragement. We realize that the seeds that we have sowed are really fruitful in remote areas where there is no electricity or TV. Let's keep praying for radio ministries - so they will stand firm constantly and all our staff will be healthy physically and spiritually."
